Participation at the 2023 Portugal Smart Cities International Summit

InCITIES participated in the 2023 Portugal Smart Cities International Summit, which focused on the relationship between municipalities, companies, and citizens, as well as key sectors like energy, mobility, health, and sustainability. Experts analysed various challenges, while spaces like Smart Garden and SmartB2B facilitated networking and business opportunities. Professor Catarina Ferreira da Silva, InCITIES coordinator, presented the project during the conference.

The event featured political leaders, including the Ministers for Territorial Cohesion and the Economy. Slovakia capital, Bratislava, was the guest city, and the summit hosted over a hundred exhibitors and speakers.

Sustainable Mobility Innovations course

The University of Žilina (UNIZA) in collaboration with the other InCITIES project partners organized the Sustainable Mobility Innovations BIP course. The course took place between the 19th of February and the 26th of April 2024 with 9 weekly online modules and 1 week of on-site seminars. Upon completion of this course, participants walked away with:

- Practical skills and strategies applicable to real-life urban mobility challenges
- Analytical frameworks for critically thinking about mobility, sustainability and resilience
- Tools and methods for planning and assessing urban mobility innovations
- Effective communication and teamwork skills among experts, stakeholders, and peers















- An invaluable experience and professional connections
- Working life skills with the Learning by Developing pedagogical model
- A certificate of competence from the University of Žilina, a world-leading transportation science university, equivalent to 3 ECTS.

InCITIES invited by the EU sister project E³UDRES² Ent-r-e-novators: Learning by Developing pedagogical model presented in the Open Science and Open Education Workshop

On June 7, 2024, the InCITIES project participated in a workshop on Open Science and Open Education, organized by the sister project E3UDRES2 Ent-r-e-novators, funded by the Horizon Europe program. Pedro Antão (ISCTE) presented "Project InCITIES - Trailblazing Inclusive, Sustainable, and Resilient Cities," highlighting the Learning by Developing (LbD) model and its link to InCITIES research HUBs. This hybrid event at the Polytechnic University of Setúbal, Portugal, featured key figures like Karel Luyben, president of the European Open Science Cloud Association, and fostered collaboration between InCITIES and other widening participation projects.

Progress towards "HR Excellence in Research Applications" of InCITIES partners

In the past year, LAUREA, Uni Eiffel, ISCTE and UNIZA made progress towards the applications for the HR Excellence in Research Award. All institutions have endorsed the Charter for Researchers in the meantime and started to form the HRS4R committees and draft the applications.

In line with InCITIES WP3 goals to develop a Human Resources Strategy for Researchers (HRS4R), the University of Žilina has committed to improving working conditions, professional development, and recruitment transparency. Having endorsed the European Charter for Researchers and the Code of Conduct in 2017 to achieve the HR Excellence in Research Award, the university conducted a gap analysis on 8 December 2023. The meeting resulted in a draft Action Plan to address identified shortcomings. On 10 April 2024, the Steering Committee and Working Group members, including R1-R4 researchers, reconvened to review unresolved issues, appoint additional members, and discuss the pre-final draft of the Action Plan.

HRS4R Final Colloquim at TH Köln

On March 11 and 12, 2024, the HRS4R final colloquium of the InCITIES work package "Talent Scout and Career Opportunities Strategy" took place at Cologne University of Applied Sciences with 18 participants from the consortium. The New Charter for Researchers as well as initiatives and practices in the areas of equality, diversity, inclusion and recruitment were discussed. The participants presented measures as part of their institutional HRS4R process and will finalise their HR strategies and action plans in order to submit their applications for the HR Excellence in Research Awards within 2024.

Since February 2024, InCITIES has been hosting 'Scientific Cafés,' a series of webinars aimed at fostering collaboration among researchers from partner universities, including TH Köln, LAUREA, ISCTE, University of Žilina, and Université Gustave Eiffel. These webinars focus on critical urban issues such as sustainability, inclusion, and mobility, offering a platform for researchers to present their work, share scientific methods, and discuss innovative approaches. The sessions, open to doctoral students, researchers, and academic staff, aim to exchange ideas, promote potential















future collaborations, such as joint publications, project proposals and student cosupervision, while encouraging technical discussions and collective problem-solving to address urban challenges.
